Agile Programme Management – 2 Days

Agile approaches are building a credible track record of success in larger multi-team projects and multi-project programmes, both within IT and across the wider business.

This training course examines the implications of Agile for the Programme Manager and how to successfully deliver strategic business change and benefits using leading Agile methods including eXtreme Programming, Scrum, DSDM (Dynamic Systems Development Method) Atern, the Agile/Open Unified Process and Lean Software Development. It also explains how to successfully introduce Agile practices to a programme or organisation and ensure a sustainable transition.

This course is intended for Managers of Agile programmes and projects, and programme team members who will benefit from an understanding of Agile Programme Management best practice.
